CHRISTMAS: We had a week break for Christmas this year to relax and celebrate. On Christmas Day, we went to our directors' house, ate a big meal, exchanged gifts, watched a Christmas movie, and played games. Mostly, it was just really great to hang out with each other not in a working environment and to have time to make some great memories and relax.
